## ***Mennonite group here***

An unusual group with an unusually timely message will be performing in the K-State Union Catskeller on Wednesday.

The Road Less Travelled is a Mennonite folk trio based in Newton, Kansas, consisting of Doug Krehbiel, Jude Krehbiel and Emory Wedel. The trio sings, acts and performs with acoustic and electric guitars and bass, and their music and lyrics center on current issues which include world hunger, nuclear arms and ecology.

Road Less Travelled will be presenting two shows in the Catskeller, both of which are free and open to the public.

The first show starts at noon and will consist of a program of music, drama and slides, and will focus on the nuclear arms race.

The second show will take place in the evening, starting at 7 and will be a variety show consisting of a melange of music — light, humorous and thought-provoking — and drama concerning human rights, world hunger and peace.
