

# Variety of music scheduled

The central musical event in Manhattan this week is clearly the American Symposium for Choral Music that starts today, but there is other music to be heard during the week as well.

The Manhattan Municipal Band plays its concert in City Park on Tuesday evening under the direction of Larry Norvell. The program will feature a vocal solo, *Flower Drum Song*, from *Carmen* sung by Jerry Langenkamp and a trumpet solo, *La Virgin De La MaCarena*, arranged by Charles Koff and performed by Mike Gaches. The concert starts at 8 p.m.

The Children's Theater Production will stage the musical *Guys and Dolls* on Friday and Saturday evenings in Arts in the Park, also starting at 8 both evenings.

Friday is a busy day for music lovers because in addition to *Guys and Dolls* there are three other concerts. At 11 a.m. participants in the Summer Institute for Gifted High School Students will present a recital of keyboard music in All Faiths Auditorium.

At 2 p.m. the Institute chorus will perform a recital, also in All Faiths. Both these recitals are free.

On Friday evening the Symposium Chorus and a select orchestra of regional instrumentalists will present Felix Mendelssohn's *Elijah*. The performance will be conducted by John Alldis and will start at 8 p.m. Admission is \$3.50.

All of the participants in the Institute for Gifted High School Students will be featured in a concert on Saturday afternoon in All Faiths Auditorium. The concert starts at 2 and admission is \$2.
