

City band to go patriotic

The Manhattan Municipal Band's salute to the Fourth of July will take place on Tuesday evening with a concert of patriotic music.

Trumpet soloist Scott Freeby will play Harry Simeone's *Trumpet in the Night* and baritone Will Robinson will sing *Battle Hymn of the Republic*.

Scott Freeby won the John Philip Sousa award while at Manhattan High School and he is currently a junior in KSU's department of music.

Will Robinson is a Manhattan resident who has sung often with the band in the past and also with local music groups.

The entire trombone section of the band will be featured in *Lassus Trombone* by Henry Fillmore.

Other items on the program include E.E. Bagley's *National Emblem March*; John Cacavas' arrangement of music by George M. Cohen, *Star Spangled Spectacular*; *God of Our Fathers*; Peter Chesnokov's *Salvation is Created*; Richard Strauss' *Also Sprach Zarathustra* (I take it that this will be a performance of the opening of the work only, since the full suite is a lengthy composition) and *Instant Concert* by Harold Walters.

The concert will conclude with two perennial favorites, *America the Beautiful* in Carmen Dragon's spectacular arrangement and Sousa's *Stars and Stripes Forever*.
