

Quartet featured in Salina

There may be every reason for chamber music lovers to consider traveling to Salina on Sunday afternoon.

The Laurentian String Quartet has been in residence at Wesleyan College for the past month and will be performing an attractively programmed concert on Sunday.

The Laurentian Quartet is based at Sarah Lawrence College in New York

State, where it is the quartet in residence. The quartet was formed in 1978, has toured extensively in Europe and the United States, has performed in Carnegie Hall and has been featured on NPR.

In 1981 the Quartet was the winner of the Artists International 9th Annual Young Musicians Auditions Chamber Award.

During the summer months the ensemble — whose members are Sung Rai Sohn and Larry Watson,

violins, Joel Rudin, viola and Dong Oo Lee, cello — is in residence at Warren Wilson College in North Carolina.

The Laurentian String Quartet will be performing the following works during its concert in Salina: Schubert's ever-fresh *Quartetsatz*, Bartok's striking *String Quartet No. 3* and the *Quartet in D major* by Felix Mendelssohn.

The concert will take place at Wesleyan College and will start at 3 p.m.
