

Recital launches music week in town

Janet Anschutz steps out of her usual role as accompanist and turns soloist when she presents a piano recital at 3 this afternoon in All Faiths. Her program will consist of *Dr. Gradus Ad Parnassum* from *The Children's Corner Suite* by Debussy, the *Eroica Variations, Op.35* by Beethoven, *Prelude and Fugue in E minor, Op.35* by Mendelssohn and Alberto Ginastera's *Piano Sonata*, composed in 1952.

On Tuesday evening, also in All Faiths, the University of Kansas Woodwind Ensemble will be performing a concert that starts at 8 p.m.

McCain Auditorium will be filled with the sounds of singing as the annual Flint Hills Choral Festival takes place all day Wednesday.

The KSU Symphony Orchestra will present its concerto concert on Friday in McCain Auditorium at 8 p.m. The concert will feature movements from concerti for (variously) piano, saxophone, piccolo, and cello, by Beethoven, Creston, Vivaldi, Bruch and Larsson. The orchestra will be conducted by Ralph Winkler.

The Manhattan High School Chamber Choir will be directed by the nationally renowned conductor Dr. Charles Hirt at 7:30 p.m. Saturday in the MHS Auditorium.
