

Recital launches musical week

Kim Flannagin will be presenting a vocal recital in All Faiths this afternoon at 3, and her program is an interesting and varied one.

The program will open with two arias, one from Handel's *Atlanta* and one from Mozart's *Il Re Pastore*. These will be followed by *Leider der Suleika* and by three songs from the lovely *Frauen Liebe und Leben* cycle by Robert Schumann. After two French songs, Ms. Flannagin will sing folk songs arranged by Copland, Vaughan Williams and Boatwright. For these latter two she will be accompanied by Steve Easterday, violin. Tenor Tom Commerford will then join Kim Flannagin for two duets, Mendelssohn's *Will you Come on Back my Darling* and Steven Foster's *Mr. and Mrs. Brown*. Janet Anschutz will be the accompanying

pianist.

There are two interesting concerts on Thursday evening. At 6.30 p.m., in the Ballroom of the K-State Union, Jasmine will play a return engagement. This duo performed most successfully in the K-State Union last year and the two talented and characterful women, playing saxophone and piano, put on a lively and tuneful show that is full of zest and of attractive music.

Jasmine is a knockout, and based on last year's performance can be highly recommended.

At 8 p.m. on Thursday, soprano Jean Sloop will present a recital full of fascinating music. Dr. Sloop will sing a work by Preston Hancock, that was composed for her in 1957, to a text by Anton Zinsser, who was not only a poet but also a member of the medical team that first isolated the typhus virus.

Next come *Poems for Music* by Wayne Barlow, who founded the electronic music studio at Eastman School of music, and this work is followed by one by Lance Massie, a composer who was a graduate classmate of our own Hanley Jackson. Violinist Ralph Winkler will join Jean Sloop for a performance of *Along the Field* by Vaughan Williams, and the recital will end with seven songs by Ivor Gurney. William Wingfield will be the pianist for this recital.
