

Soloists featured at Band concert

The 8th Annual Arts and Crafts Festival continues this afternoon with music from the talented local troubadour, Mark Selby at 2 p.m. in the park.

On Tuesday evening the Municipal Band presents a concert in the pavilion. The concert will include *Military Escorts* by Harold Bennett, a *Toccata* by Frescobaldi, and Leroy Anderson's *Trumpet Lullaby* in which the soloist will be Sandy Anthony.

The other soloists will be Ben Rohrer, saxophone, in Alfred Reed's *Ballade*, and baritone J.V. Heffel in Albert Malotte's arrangement of *The Lord's Prayer*.

John Bowman will be the guest conductor for Claude Smith's

arrangement of *Shenandoah*, and Larry Norvell will direct the rest of the concert which starts at 8 p.m.

Trumpeter Sandy Anthony is a graduate of MHS and she majored in music at KSU for three years before switching to the field of data processing. Ms. Anthony has been a member of the municipal band for three years.

Ben Rohrer is also a graduate of Manhattan High School and he received his degree in music from North Texas State University. At present Mr. Rohrer is pursuing a master's degree in music performance at KSU and is a graduate assistant with the KSU bands.

Baritone J.V. Heffel has won the National Association of Teachers of Singing voice competition for the past three years and he is at present

working towards an undergraduate degree at KSU in vocal performance.

John Bowman is a graduate of Chanute High School, and received his undergraduate degree from the University of Kansas. He is currently a graduate assistant at KSU.

Also on Tuesday the Church Organist and Service Playing Workshop starts at the KSU Music Department. The workshop, which runs until Friday, features Mary Ellen Sutton, Margot Ann Woolard and Brett Wolgast.

On Thursday evening the Christian Bell Choir will perform in Arts in the Park, starting at 8 p.m.

Thursday also sees the start of the String Instrument Repair Workshop at the KSU Music Department which will be conducted by Gene Bearden and associates.

Brett Wolgast will be the organist for a recital in All Faiths Auditorium which will start at 8 p.m.

On Friday at Arts in the Park, the Ebony Gospel Choir, re-formed from what was the Salem Inspirational Gospel Choir, will sing in concert.

Finally, on Saturday evening in Arts in the Park, Black Horse Country will entertain.
