Also in All Faiths, for those who want to make a musical feast of the day, Ben Rohrer will perform a saxophone recital at 8 p.m.

Two violinists can be heard on Monday evening when Diane Rader

and Cathy Cunningham present a joint recital at 8 p.m. in All Faiths.

On Tuesday the KSU Men's and Women's Glee Clubs under the direction of Gerald Polich will sing a program that will include music by Brahms, Handel and Schumann as well as lighter fare, spirituals and the *Big Eight Fight Songs*. This concert will be in All Faiths and will start at 8 p.m.
